CREATING AFFORDABLE HOUSING

- We will double the number of new subsidized and und affordable apartments from 2,000 to 4,000 annually.
- We will commission 2,000 new housing units to be constructed annually by municipal companies, up from 1,250 currently.
- **>>** We will raise the proportion of subsidized housing on municipal land from 50% to 60%.
- We will use the regulations on municipal development ("Städtebauliche Entwicklungsmaßnahme") to create affordable housing and prevent speculation by private interests.

KEEPING MUNICH GREEN

- We will prioritise liveability and the preservation of green spaces and leisure areas in Munich.
- We will preserve valuable undeveloped land and only allow development on land designated for construction.
- We will protect Munich's old growth trees, and will create a tree registry to ensure the protection and conservation of all of Munich's trees.
- We will preserve the natural spaces along the Isar, and we will recover the city's streams and waterways currently channelled underground.
- We will act on the demands of the "Save the Bees" plebiscite

MORE SPACE FOR PEDESTRIANS AND CYCLISTS

- We will create a cycle path right round the city centre, and create a network of cycle routes that links all districts of Munich.
- We will ensure that all cycle paths are at least 2,30m wide, to foster safe cyling.
- » We will make Munich's city centre car-free.
- » We will expand current pedestrian zones and create new ones where needed.
- We promise to create five new wheelchair accessible bridges/walkways over railway lines, motorways, and waterways each year.

EXPANDING THE BUS AND U-BAHN NETWORK

- » We will create a one-price 365€ ticket for residents of Munich; for children, young people, and those with mobility problems, public transport will be free of charge.
- We will continue to campaign at both federal and state levels for an S-Bahn circular route (construction of S-Bahn ring south and ring north).
- We will extend the U-Bahn U5 as far as Freiham, the U4 to Englschalking, and create a new line U9 to reduce pressure on central connection points.
- We will create new tram routes in the south, west, and north of the city.
- We will develop express bus routes in the outlying districts, to connect S-Bahn and U-Bahn lines.

MAKING A CLIMATE-NEUTRAL CITY

- » All decisions by the city council will be subject to a CO₂ review before they can be passed.
- We will create a climate protection fund with the aim of making the city climate neutral by 2035.
- We will abide by the result of the citizen's vote on divestment from coal and will minimise the use of coal leading up to the decommissioning of coal-fired power stations.
- We will further develop the renewable energy sector in Munich, raising the output of solar power plants from 5MW to 15MW annually.
- We will raise the energy standards for buildings ("KfW-Effizienzhaus 40") and will support homeowners and tenants with subsidies.

NO ROOM FOR THE FAR-RIGHT!

- » We stand with all those who suffer from the impact of right-wing hate speech and will protect their access to advice and support.
- » We will invest in local networks against right-wing extremism.
- » We will provide more funding for youth work and educational projects.



BUILDING ON MUNICH'S DIVERSITY

- » We will introduce a quota for management positions in the municipal administration, with at least 50% of positions to be held by women.
- » We will step up our support for LGBTIO school projects such as diversity@school or the "Aufklärungsprojekt".
- » Inclusivity will be written into all municipal programs.
- » We will provide support to enable refugees to play an active part in Munich society.
- » We will expand our work developing linguistic competence for children and young people.





PUTTING THE CITY ONLINE

- » We will digitalise muncipal services, and make them available via one single online account.
- » We will publish information about municipal administration processes in an open data portal.
- » We will help more people to get involved by using online platforms for civic meetings.
- » We will bring free Wi-Fi to U-Bahn trains and huses



DOING GOOD GREEN BUSINESS

- » We will reform the criteria for commercial land development and will ensure equality between economic interests, social justice, and ecological protection.
- » We will create new business parks and a second technology centre to support small businesses and start-ups.
- » We will ban single-use plastics in sphere of influence.



EXPANDING SOCIAL SERVICES

- » We will create sufficient childcare availability, for example through a recruitment drive to train more staff.
- » We will launch an immediate programme to end homelessness amongst children.
- We will expand and improve services to protect against winter cold.
- We will build more municipal hostels, especially flexi-hostels, to provide appropriate accommodation for those in need.
- We will expand home visits by social workers to help the elderly out of poverty.
- The costs of municipal services will be incomedependent, so that everyone has access to the services they need.

POSTAL VOTE

Send your completed and signed application for postal vote (which is sent to you along with your polling card) to the electoral office (Wahlamt) or apply online or in person at the electoral office. Applications by telephone are not accepted. Fill in your postal vote according to the instructions, and don't forget to send it in before the deadline: only postal votes that are received by 6 p.m. on polling day can be counted.
